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# STATISTICAL REPORT ON INTERNATIONAL ASSISTANCE 2016-2017

## ABOUT THIS REPORT

In accordance with the *Official Development Assistance Accountability Act* (ODAAA or the Act), the Minister of International Development is required to issue the following two key reports on behalf of the Government of Canada:

- *Report to Parliament on the Government of Canada's Official Development Assistance*, tabled in Parliament within six months after the end of each fiscal year; and
- *Statistical Report on International Assistance*, published within one year after the end of each fiscal year.

The *Statistical Report on International Assistance* is produced on an annual basis to further enhance the efficiency and accountability of Canada's international assistance. This report covers the reporting period April 1, 2016, to March 31, 2017 (fiscal year 2016–2017).

As one of the two annual reports legislated by the Act, this report provides a single source for international assistance expenditure statistics, including official development assistance (ODA) and other official assistance, for Canada as a whole.

## UNDERSTANDING THIS REPORT

This report is presented on an expenditures basis and uses international standards that facilitate historical comparison of Canada's ODA as well as comparison with reports from other international assistance donors.

Expenditures are counted when the payment is recorded in the accounting systems, with the understanding that organizations receiving Canadian funding would utilize it over the length of the project.

Repayments of loans previously extended to developing countries are shown for information purposes (see appendices 1 and 2).

Certain costs (e.g. refugee resettlement costs) are calculated based on agreed-upon international standards. Such standards are regularly revised in forums such as the Development Assistance Committee of the Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD-DAC).

## TRANSPARENCY AND ACCOUNTABILITY

The Government of Canada is committed to ensuring information on its international assistance funding is open and transparent.

All reports prepared in accordance with the ODAAA are available on the [Development Reports](#) web page. To further enhance the efficiency and accountability of Canada's international assistance, Global Affairs Canada also provides all Canadian international development statistical data on its [Open Data](#) web portal.

In addition, Global Affairs Canada provides detailed and up-to-date information on its international assistance projects on the [Project Browser](#) application. This information is also published daily in accordance with the standard of the International Aid Transparency Initiative (IATI), of which Canada is a member and outgoing chair.

Finance Canada and the International Development Research Centre also publish data in accordance with the IATI standard.

# SCOPE OF INTERNATIONAL ASSISTANCE STATISTICS


**International assistance** includes all financial resources provided by Canadian governments (federal, provincial, or municipal) toward development assistance.

**The International Assistance Envelope (IAE)** is the Government of Canada's dedicated pool of resources and main budget planning tool to support international assistance objectives. The IAE funds over 85% of Canada's international assistance. The envelope is used to fund the majority of Canada's ODAAA-related activities and other specific activities that do not meet the definition of ODA, such as certain peace and security efforts.

**Official Development Assistance (ODA)** represents the vast majority of Canada's international assistance. Canada accepts two definitions of ODA:

1. ODA, as defined by the **Development Assistance Committee of the Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD-DAC)**. This definition is used to compare ODA among donors.
2. ODA, as defined by **Canada's Official Development Assistance Accountability Act (denoted as ODAAA)**. This definition is used in Government of Canada publications.

## CANADA'S INTERNATIONAL ASSISTANCE (IA)



1. **The OECD-DAC defines ODA** as flows to countries and territories on the DAC List of ODA Recipients and to multilateral institutions. Funding must meet the following criteria:

- i. provided by official agencies, including state and local governments, or by their executive agencies; and
- ii. each transaction of which:
  - a. is administered with the promotion of the economic development and welfare of developing countries as its main objective; and
  - b. is concessional in character and conveys a grant element of at least 25% (calculated at a rate of discount of 10%).

2. **Canada's ODAAA** spending is compatible with the definition above, but in addition must meet the three criteria set out in Section 4.1 of the Act: a) contribute to poverty reduction; b) take into account the perspectives of the poor; and c) be consistent with international human rights standards.

Given the ODAAA applies to federal spending only, it excludes international assistance provided by provinces, territories and municipalities. International assistance to alleviate the effects of a disaster or other emergencies occurring in an ODA-eligible country is also counted as ODA under the Act.

Note: overseas programs that are not ODA, nor funded by the IAE, such as military operations, are **not** considered international assistance.



\*\* The "ODA: OECD-DAC" figures presented in this table are shown on a fiscal year basis, in Canadian dollars, in order to compare and contrast reporting under the ODA44 versus the ODA reported to the OECD. When Canada reports to the OECD-DAC, figures are reported on a calendar-year basis in US dollars. Their depiction in this table is for illustrative purposes only. In addition, loan repayments are excluded from this table to enable comparison between columns. The ODA44 requires departments to report on their gross disbursements whereas the OECD reports on both a gross and a net basis. Loan repayments are disclosed in Table A as an information item.

# CANADA USES A WHOLE-OF-GOVERNMENT APPROACH TO DELIVER EFFECTIVE RESULTS









### JORDAN HDI RANK<sup>3</sup>: 86/188

Since the onset of the Syrian conflict, Jordan has provided refuge to over 700,000 Syrians. This influx of people is straining the Government of Jordan's ability to meet the needs of its citizens in health, education, water and municipal service delivery. As a response, Canada's assistance to Jordan has increased dramatically over the past few years, from being the 19th recipient of Canadian assistance in 2014–2015 to second in 2016–2017. In line with Canada's Middle East strategy in response to the crises in Iraq and Syria, Canada's programming in Jordan is strengthening the resilience and capacity of government, communities and people in education, economic growth and municipal service delivery.

### AFGHANISTAN HDI RANK<sup>3</sup>: 169/188

Widespread poverty and the deterioration of the country's infrastructure from ongoing conflict have left many Afghans without access to basic services. In 2016–2017, Afghanistan was the largest recipient of Canadian international assistance. Canadian support is helping to create a more peaceful environment that is safe and secure for all Afghans by strengthening the Afghan National Defense and Security Forces and supporting the Government of Afghanistan in its efforts to eliminate all known landmines and other explosive remnants of war in Afghanistan by 2023. Canadian development initiatives in Afghanistan are framed by a "Women's and Girls' Right's First" approach toward health, education, and women's and girls' rights and empowerment programming.



### ETHIOPIA HDI RANK<sup>3</sup>: 174/188

Canada's development assistance program in Ethiopia focuses on increasing agriculture, food security and nutrition for the poorest and most vulnerable; fostering economic growth, particularly targeting women and youth entrepreneurs; ending child, early and forced marriage; addressing sexual and gender-based violence against women, and sexual and reproductive health and rights for adolescent girls; and promoting accountable governance and pluralism. Canada's assistance improves year-round access to food and helps men and women farmers improve their agricultural productivity, to build their resilience to climate change through better soil and water conservation practices, as well as improve their access to markets. This assistance is particularly important to reduce vulnerability to hunger and malnutrition due to frequent drought conditions.



### SYRIA

The ongoing Syrian conflict resulted in 6.3 million internally displaced people and increasing humanitarian needs. Canada's humanitarian programming in Syria focussed on life-saving assistance such as food assistance, safe water treatment, health services and support to protect civilians. Programming also contributes to addressing sexual and gender-based violence and meeting the sexual and reproductive health needs of women and girls.

### JORDAN / IRAQ / LEBANON

Canadian support assisted thousands of Syrian refugees, asylum seekers and displaced persons with cash assistance, food, shelter, protection, and health and education services in Jordan, Iraq and Lebanon, as well as in Egypt, Turkey and Syria. Sexual and gender-based violence and sexual and reproductive health needs were also addressed in Canadian programming.

### SOUTH SUDAN

Ongoing conflict and ethnic violence, massive population displacement, widespread human rights violations and rapid economic decline contributed to increased humanitarian needs in South Sudan. Canada's support included the provision of food, nutrition, and water, sanitation and hygiene services, as well as increasing access to emergency and basic health services for vulnerable populations, particularly women and girls.

### RESPONDING TO REGIONAL CRISES

In order to respond to regional crises and protracted humanitarian situations, Canada also provides funding through an established international humanitarian response system that includes the International Red Cross and Red Crescent Movement, experienced non-governmental organizations and UN organizations, such as the Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs, the UN High Commissioner for Refugees, UNICEF and the World Food Programme.


# CANADA'S MAJOR FINANCIAL COMMITMENTS

## GENDER EQUALITY AND THE EMPOWERMENT OF WOMEN AND GIRLS

In 2017, through its Feminist International Assistance Policy, Canada committed to increasing to 95% the proportion of its bilateral international development assistance investments that target or integrate gender equality and the empowerment of women and girls by 2021–2022. In fiscal year 2016–2017, Canada reached the 82% target for integrated and targeted programming. The Policy will contribute directly to progress on the sustainable development goal 5 (Achieve gender equality and empower all women and girls), while also supporting the 2030 Agenda's other goals and targets.

## CANADA'S FEMINIST INTERNATIONAL ASSISTANCE POLICY

In June 2017, the Government of Canada launched Canada's Feminist International Assistance Policy that seeks to eradicate poverty and build a more peaceful, more inclusive and more prosperous world. It will be put into action through six action areas:

- Gender equality and the empowerment of women and girls;
- Human dignity;
- Growth that works for everyone;
- Environment and climate action;
- Inclusive governance; and
- Peace and security

The policy is aligned with the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development and its 17 Sustainable Development Goals (SDG)

## SEXUAL AND REPRODUCTIVE HEALTH AND RIGHTS


In 2017, as part of its commitment to the empowerment of women and girls and gender equality, Canada announced \$650 million over 3 years to support a comprehensive approach to sexual and reproductive health and rights (SRHR) of women and adolescents. This includes the full range of SRHR services, including safe, legal abortion and post-abortion care; family planning; comprehensive sexuality education; and prevention of all forms of sexual and gender-based violence.

## STRONG FOCUS ON HEALTH

Canada has long supported the improvement of maternal, newborn and child health (MNCH), as reflected in its commitment to intensify efforts for 2015–2020 by pledging to spend \$3.5 billion. This support has focused on strengthening health systems, reducing the burden of disease, improving nutrition and improving data generation and use. Canada is well on track to reaching its goal, having spent \$1.38 billion within the first 2 fiscal years on initiatives aiming to improve access to health care and nutrition, and reduce illness and disease for the target population.

### CANADA'S MNCH FINANCING (2010-2020)




## ENVIRONMENT AND CLIMATE ACTION

Canada is delivering on its pledge to contribute \$2.65 billion between 2015 and 2020 toward climate change projects and initiatives in developing countries. Between 2015 and 2017, Canada disbursed over \$430 million on projects that will reduce greenhouse gas emissions and increase climate resilience, particularly for the poorest and most vulnerable. So far, Canada's assistance helped financing a great variety of projects, including strengthening climate risk management in Africa, developing climate smart agriculture in Central America and supporting renewable energy and energy efficiency in the Caribbean. This action on climate change supports the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development's SDG 13 (Take urgent action to combat climate change and its impacts).

### CANADA'S INTERNATIONAL CLIMATE FINANCING (CUMULATIVE, 2015-2021)




## CANADA'S MIDDLE EAST STRATEGY

In February 2016, Canada announced its renewed and enhanced strategy in the Middle East in response to the crises in Iraq and Syria and their impact on Jordan and Lebanon. Canada's Middle East Strategy will allocate \$2 billion over three years to the region for humanitarian, development and security assistance, as well as to the Operation IMPACT military mission.\* A significant portion of this amount, \$1.3 billion, is under Global Affairs Canada's responsibility and focuses on security for civilians, humanitarian assistance and development assistance. During 2016–2017 Canada spent \$429 million on these 3 objectives, providing food assistance, protection and education for those affected by the Syrian crisis in that country and in surrounding countries.

In order to maintain our status as a member in good standing, Canada is required to provide its share of the total operations costs.</p>

The funding to the World Bank's International Development Association and to the International Monetary Fund is reported to Parliament through the Main Estimates of the Department of Finance. 	<b>fiscal year</b>	This report is prepared on the fiscal-year basis adopted by the Government of Canada. The 2014-2015 fiscal year began April 1, 2014, and ended March 31, 2015.
<b>G</b>	<b>general budget support</b>	This refers to a particular category defined by the OECD-DAC as unearmarked contributions to the government budget, support for the implementation of macroeconomic reforms (structural adjustment programs, poverty reduction strategies), and general program assistance (when not allocable by sector).
	<b>Geographic Programs</b>	This Global Affairs Canada Branch delivers the majority of Global Affairs Canada's bilateral assistance through programs for a given country (see definition for "country programs") or through regional programs (see definition of "regional programs").
	<b>Global Affairs Canada</b>	Under this Department, Canada continues to advance its priorities abroad by undertaking diplomacy and programming in support of international peace and security, democracy, human rights and the rule of law. The development side of Global Affairs Canada remains dedicated to deliver tangible results for those most in need in the developing world and the Department continues to provide whole-of-government coordination in response to international crises and natural disasters.
	<b>Global Issues and Development</b>	This Global Affairs Canada Branch, formerly known as Multilateral and Global Programs Branch, manages the development aspects of Canada's relations with multilateral organizations, provides financial support for these organizations, and helps determine their policies and programs throughout the world.  Global Issues and Development delivers bilateral and multilateral assistance. See related definitions of "bilateral assistance" and "multilateral assistance."
	<b>Global Partnership Program</b>	It is the main mechanism through which Canada supports international efforts through concrete projects to prevent the proliferation of weapons and materials of mass destruction (WMD) and their potential use by terrorists.
	<b>Global Peace and Security Program</b>	Responds to increasing international demand for Canadian support and involvement in complex crises, including conflicts and natural disasters, and to coordinate whole-of-government engagements in fragile and conflict-affected states. The program also integrates policy, operations, coordination and programming in order to provide agile, timely and responsive programming to further advance the government's priorities in the important area of peace and security.
<b>H</b>	<b>Health Canada</b>	This refers to assistance expenditures incurred by the Department of Health Canada in support of the Pan-American Health Organization. Through PAHO, Canada advances multilateral and bilateral relations in health, and provides technical cooperation and capacity building (see Table A).
<b>I</b>	<b>imputed foreign student costs</b>	This refers to the cost of educating foreign students from ODA-eligible countries in Canada. It excludes tuition fees paid by foreign students or their sponsors. See definition of "ODA-eligible imputed costs."
	<b>international assistance</b>	Canada's international assistance is composed of any financial resource provided by Canadian governments (federal, provincial, or municipal) in favour of development assistance. It is important to note that not all international assistance is considered official development assistance (ODA).  See section "Understanding this report" for more information.
	<b>International Assistance Envelope (IAE)</b>	The International Assistance Envelope (IAE) is a dedicated pool of resources that enables the Government of Canada to deploy its international assistance nimbly and responsively. The envelope is used to fund the majority of Canada's ODA-related activities, and other specific activities that do not meet the definition of ODA such as select peace and security efforts and non-concessional loans for international climate change initiatives.

<b>International Business Development and Innovation</b>	This Global Affairs Canada Branch supports private sector engagement and the management and administration of a number of international scholarship opportunities for Canadians and foreign students.
<b>International Development Association (IDA)</b>	<p>The IDA is the part of the World Bank that helps the world's poorest countries. The IDA is funded largely by contributions from the governments of its developed member countries. The IDA lends money (known as credits) on concessional terms. This means that IDA credits have no interest charge, and repayments are stretched out over 35–40 years, including a 10-year grace period. The IDA also provides grants to countries at risk of debt distress.</p> <p>Canadian funding to IDA is managed by the Department of Finance Canada, and is represented in the form of note encashments.</p>
<b>International Development Research Centre (IDRC)</b>	Refers to ODA spent by IDRC, a Canadian Crown corporation funded through the IAE, that invests in knowledge, innovation, and solutions to improve lives and livelihoods in the developing world.
<b>international financial institution (IFI)</b>	IFIs are financial institutions that have been established (or chartered) by more than one country, and are therefore subject to international law. Their owners or shareholders are generally national governments, although other international institutions and other organizations occasionally figure as shareholders. The most prominent IFIs are creations of multiple nations, although some bilateral financial institutions (created by two countries) exist and are technically IFIs. Many of these are multilateral development banks. The best-known IFIs are the World Bank, the IMF, and regional development banks.
<b>international humanitarian assistance (IHA)</b>	<p>IHA is defined as assistance designed to save lives, alleviate suffering, and maintain and protect human dignity during emergencies and in their aftermath. <b>International Humanitarian Assistance Bureau</b>	<p>This Global Affairs Canada Bureau responds to funding requests from multilateral humanitarian organizations such as the United Nations World Food Programme, UNICEF and other experienced humanitarian partners, including the Red Cross Movement and NGOs, except in West Bank/Gaza where the country program also provides humanitarian assistance.</p> <p>Please refer to table B2 for a detailed summary of Canada's international humanitarian assistance.</p>
<b>International Scholarship Program</b>	Attracts international students and researchers to Canada by offering scholarships to Canadian and foreign students and by promoting government funded awards.

<b>multilateral assistance (as opposed to bilateral assistance, also known as long-term institutional support to multilateral organizations)</b>	<p>Multilateral assistance is funding provided to a multilateral institution that:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• conducts all or part of its activities in favour of development;</li> <li>• is an international agency, institution, or organization whose members are governments, or a fund managed autonomously by such an agency; and</li> <li>• pools contributions so that they become an integral part of the financial assets.</li> </ul> <p>In this report, the term "multilateral assistance" includes both ODA and non-ODA elements.</p> <p>In an effort to estimate/impute the portion of assistance going through those organizations to developing countries, the OECD has developed a series of coefficients based on flow of resources (on a calendar-year basis) disbursed by the organizations in the developing countries. Such funds typically need to reach a certain funding threshold before disbursements begin, sometime after Canada's contribution.

Limits of data on multilateral outflows. While a number of multilateral agencies report to the OECD on the use of their funding (by country, by sector, etc.) some do not. Therefore, the country and sector breakdowns of those organisations are estimated using other sources, such as annual reports.

Grants to lending institutions. Some institutions lend rather than grant funds. Their lending in any one year may be much greater than donors' contributions, since it also draws on refloes of principal, interest receipts, and transfers of funds within the institution.

<b>multilateral organizations</b>	<p>The OECD-DAC defines multilateral organizations as international institutions with governmental membership that conduct all, or a significant part, of their activities in favour of development and assistance recipient countries. They include multilateral development banks (e.g. the World Bank and regional development banks), United Nations agencies, international public-private partnerships (PPPs), and regional groupings (e.g. certain European Union and Arab agencies).</p> <p>Global Affairs Canada; Health Canada; Public Health Agency of Canada; Environment and Climate Change Canada; Innovation, Science and Economic Development Canada; and the Canada Post Corporation made contributions toward regular budgets of certain multilateral organizations (also called long-term institutional support or core funding). <b>O ODA-eligible imputed costs</b>	<p>This describes a cost category that is eligible for ODA status under the OECD-DAC guidelines, but with no actual expenditure data readily available. Instead, an estimate is produced based on a statistical model and/or professional judgement. This includes the cost of refugees (first year), imputed foreign student costs, services provided without charge by other government departments and imputed interest on advance payments, for which definitions can be found in this glossary. The new Policy on Transfer Payments no longer requires departments to report the imputed interest costs on advance payments and therefore these costs no longer appear in the Statistical Report.</p>
<b>Office of Religious Freedom</b>	<p>The Religious Freedom Fund supports religious communities that are facing intolerance or persecution in their country outside Canada through projects in four areas: education on freedom of religion and pluralism, research and monitoring, interreligious dialogue, and legal and legislative support.</p>
<b>official bilateral debt relief</b>	<p>Official bilateral debt relief refers to debt-service relief negotiated through multilateral forums such as the Paris Club. The transfer of funds, administered by the Department of Finance Canada, is considered ODA-eligible. Starting in 2012-2013, EDC reports contributions to the HIPC debt initiative. These were previously reported by Finance Canada.</p>
<b>official development assistance (ODA)</b>	<p>In Canada, "official development assistance" may refer to:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. the international definition created by the Development Assistance Committee of the Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD-DAC); or</li><li>2. the definition established in the Official Development Assistance Accountability Act (ODAAA).</li></ol> <p>Unless otherwise specified, "official development assistance," as used in this statistical report, refers to the definition in the ODAAA. ODA represents the vast majority of Canada's international assistance. For more information, look in the section "Understanding this report" at the beginning of this document.</p>
<b>Operations and management (see also administrative costs)</b>	<p>In this report this term represents the operations and management costs directly incurred by the donor agency to cover the day-to-day costs of extending international assistance. See also "administrative costs".</p>
<b>other official assistance (also known as non-ODA)</b>	<p>This refers to activities that do not meet the conditions for eligibility as Official Development Assistance because they are not primarily aimed at development (e.g. counter-terrorism capacity building, military observers). On the other hand, incremental costs incurred for the use of the donor's military equipment to deliver humanitarian assistance or perform development services are ODA-eligible (for example, emergency assistance by the Disaster Assistance Response Team). Activities outside the IAE that are not ODA eligible are considered out-of-scope of this report and hence not reported (e.g., military-related training, supply of military equipment and services to peacekeeping missions, and the forgiveness of debts incurred for military purposes).</p>
<b>P Partnerships for Development Innovation</b>	<p>This Global Affairs Canada Branch provides opportunities for Canadians to engage in international development and contributes to initiatives designed and delivered predominantly by Canadian civil society organizations, private sector, colleges, universities, research entities, provincial and regional councils and foundations. The Branch facilitates knowledge exchange across the department, with civil society and international partners to advance innovative approaches to international development.</p>
<b>Payables at Year-End</b>	<p>The recording against the current fiscal year of liabilities incurred but which have not been paid by the end of the accounting period.</p>
<b>program assistance</b>	<p>This term refers to international assistance spending by Global Affairs Canada's assistance programs, excluding operations and management costs, and changes in the value of investments in IFIs.</p>
<b>provincial governments</b>	<p>This refers to international assistance programs of the provinces of Quebec, Manitoba, Alberta and Saskatchewan. For example, the Government of Quebec provides long-term institutional support to certain multilateral institutions such as the Organisation internationale de la Francophonie (OIF), and undertakes bilateral projects in a number of countries. The Official Development Assistance Accountability Act does not apply to these programs.</p>
<b>Public Health Agency of Canada</b>	<p>This refers to assistance expenditures incurred by the Public Health Agency of Canada in support of the Pan-American Health Organization (see Table A).</p>

<b>R</b>	<p><b>regional development banks</b></p> <p><b>regional programs</b></p>	<p>These are International Financial Institutions (IFIs) that are owned and operated by member nations. They are designed to extend development loans and provide other assistance to member nations. The world's five regional development banks are the African Development Bank Group, Asian Development Bank, European Bank for Reconstruction and Development, Caribbean Development Bank, and Inter-American Development Bank.</p> <p>Refers to regional programs managed by Global Affairs Canada's Geographic Programs Bureau (see definition) that address the regional issues countries face together. In Table D-1 and Table D-2, these programs are reported separately from country programs. See definition of "country programs."</p>
	<b>Royal Canadian Mounted Police (RCMP)</b>	This refers to ODA disbursements made by the RCMP for bilateral programs aimed at post-conflict peacebuilding and security system management and reform.
<b>S</b>	<b>sector codes (Table B-1)</b>	<p>Sector codes are used to describe the purpose of assistance. The list of sectors is compiled by the OECD-DAC. From time to time, modifications are made with the approval of donor countries. The OECD-DAC sector classification contains the following broad categories:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• social infrastructure and services – covering the sectors of education, health, population, water, government, and civil society;</li> <li>• economic infrastructure and services – covering transport, communications, energy, banking and finance, and business services;</li> <li>• production – covering agriculture, forestry, fishing, industry, mining, construction, trade, and tourism; and</li> <li>• multi-sector – covering, for example, general environmental protection; other multi-sector assistance, including urban and rural development; and non-sector allocable assistance for contributions not susceptible to allocation by sector, such as general budget support, actions relating to debt, humanitarian assistance, and internal transactions in the donor country.</li> </ul> <p>The sector of destination of a contribution provides the specific area of the recipient's economic or social structure the transfer is intended to foster. The sector classification does not refer to the type of goods or services provided.</p> <p>Due to differences in timing and methodology, the figures reported in Table B-1 will vary significantly from those reported in "Table 5: Official Bilateral Commitments by Sector of Destination" of the OECD-DAC's questionnaire on ODA.</p> <p>There are three main reasons for these discrepancies:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• fiscal year vs. calendar year – The Statistical Report on Official Development Assistance is based on the Government of Canada's fiscal year; however, the DAC questionnaire is based on the calendar year.</li> <li>• commitments vs. disbursements – The DAC's Table 5 is prepared on a commitment basis rather than when funds are actually disbursed.</li> <li>• proportionate coding – Global Affairs Canada's systems permit coding many sectors against any given contribution; however, the OECD's reporting allows only for a single purpose code for each assistance project/program.</li> </ul>
	<b>services provided without charge by other departments</b>	This refers to costs incurred by other departments for accommodation, legal, and cheque-issuing services rendered to Global Affairs Canada. See definition of ODA-eligible imputed costs.
	<b>Services rendered abroad</b>	Refer to the common services provided to Global Affairs Canada personnel, both Canada-based and locally-engaged, at Canada's diplomatic and consular missions abroad. These funds help to facilitate the presence of development officers in the field and support international assistance project implementation.
	<b>Strategic Communications Bureau</b>	Amounts related to this bureau of Global Affairs Canada represent assistance program expenditures to promote development. The program supports the efforts of Canadians through mass media and educational initiatives.
	<b>Strategic Policy and Summits</b>	This Global Affairs Canada Branch, formerly known as Strategic Policy and Performance Branch, represents ODA-eligible international assistance expenditures made by Global Affairs Canada for representing Canada at international forums on development and ensuring that international commitments are reflected in Canadian development policies.
<b>U</b>	<b>Unallocable or non-allocable assistance (as opposed to allocable assistance)</b>	When assistance disbursements cannot be assigned by country or sector, (e.g. costs of refugees in Canada) the disbursement is referred to as unallocable or non-allocable.
